
Domitille Baizeau has been practising dispute resolution for nearly 20 years, exclusively in international arbitration (commercial and investment) since 2001. She has acted in over 50 international disputes as counsel or arbitrator (more than 20 cases as co-arbitrator, sole arbitrator or presiding arbitrator), in administered arbitration proceedings (including ICC, LCIA, Swiss Rules, WIPO, SCC, AAA/ICDR) and ad hoc proceedings (including UNCITRAL), governed by various procedural and substantive laws, both common law and civil law, including English, American, French and Swiss, and by international law. She regularly advises clients on arbitration-related matters including drafting of arbitration agreements, challenges and enforcement of arbitral awards.

Her areas of specialization include joint venture, share purchase, M&A, sales, agency, distribution, privatisation and investment disputes in the energy (oil & gas, solar, mining), telecommunications, construction, commodities and transport sectors.

She has been recommended for several years by Chambers (Global and Europe) for international arbitration and by The International Who's Who of Commercial Arbitration. In 2011, she was selected as one of 45 "leading figures" in international arbitration below the age of 45, following a peer-review process conducted by *Global Arbitration Law Review*.

Domitille Baizeau is a member of the Arbitration Court of the Swiss Chambers' Arbitration Institution which administers arbitrations subject to the Swiss Rules of International Arbitration, a member of the Board and the Executive Committee of ASA, the Swiss Arbitration Association, an officer of the European Users' Council of the LCIA, and a member of the Executive Committee of the Swedish Arbitration Association (SAA). She is also listed on several panels of arbitrators outside Switzerland. She regularly speaks at conferences and publishes in international arbitration and was for several years a member of the Editorial Board of the ASA Bulletin.

Before joining LALIVE in 2004, Domitille Baizeau practiced in litigation and arbitration with a leading business law firm in New Zealand and with Freshfields Bruckhaus Deringer in Paris. She graduated from the University of Canterbury in New Zealand in 1995 (LL.B. First Class Honours) and also holds a Diploma in French law from the Université Paris II Assas-Panthéon.
